



BACOG Facilitates Safe Drinking Water in Your Home Private Well Water Quality Testing Program

This fall the Barrington Area Council of Governments (BACOG) and Lake Barrington in partnership with Lake County Health Department are facilitating local access to water quality tests to Barrington Area residents. Annual water quality tests for bacteria and nitrates are recommended for all homeowners with private wells. Lake Barrington Shores has its own community well and is tested annually as a public system therefore water quality testing for LBS residents is not necessary.

Residents may pick up a test kit for \$16 between Sept. 13 and 27 at Village Hall located at 23860 N. Old Barrington Road, Mon.- Fri. from 8:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. **Your water sample must be dropped off between 3-9 PM on Sept 27th, at Good Shepherd Health and Fitness Center - 1301 S Barrington Rd.** Drop your sample off at 7 p.m. on Sept. 27th to join water professionals for short presentations and the opportunity to ask questions of a panel of experts on well and septic, water quality issues, and water supply.

Lake County Health Department laboratories will analyze tests and return results to residents. Availability is limited for the September launch, so please call in advance to ensure a kit is available.

Natural Transformation

The new rain garden and naturalized storm water basin are flourishing with native species plants. By replacing the turf grass with select plantings, the need to mow the area is eliminated and runoff from the parking lot and playground area is filtered. The ecosystem is also enhanced with animals and insects.

A partnership of the Village and the Flint Creek Watershed Partnership in cooperation with Trillium Native Landscapes was awarded an Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) 319 grant which is funding 60% of the transformation of the east side of Village Hall.

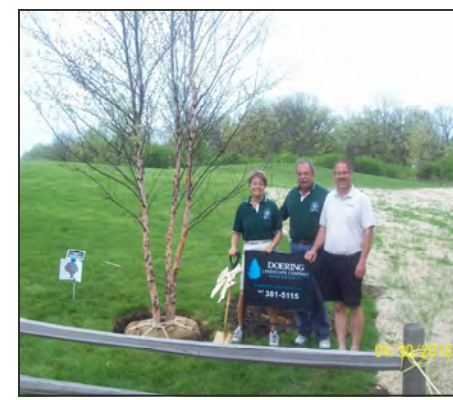
Health & Wellness

Cleaning out the garage or basement this fall and wondering how to get rid of unused chemicals, paint, large items, and electronics?

Bulk Pick Ups

If you are disposing a large amount of items, please contact Waste Management prior to collection day to schedule a bulk pick-up at (800) 796-9696. A fee may apply.

Appliances & Large Items Pick Up

For appliances and large items that Waste Management does not pick up, contact Environmental Field Services at (800) 480-4337. A separate fee will be charged.

Household Chemical Waste & Electronics Collection The Solid Waste Agency of Lake County (SWALCO) hosts household chemical waste and electronics collection events around the county and has a permanent drop-off facility in Gurnee by appointment only. For collection events schedules, collection guidelines, and disposal/redirection/recycling ideas, go to www.swalco.org or call (847)336-9340.

You can also drop-off your **electronics** at the Cuba Township Road District on Fridays between 7 a.m.—3 p.m. at their facility located at 28070 W. Cuba Road, Barrington. For more information, call (847) 381-7793.

Latex paints are not accepted at collection sites and should be solidified before disposing with your regular garbage. SWALCO suggests taking the lids off the paint cans and adding an absorbent such as kitty litter, sand, or shredded paper. When the liquid paint is absorbed, leave the lids off the paint cans and dispose of them in your regular waste (not recycling) for pick-up.

Lake County residents may drop off old **motor oil** at Lake Zurich's Public Works facility, located at 505 Telser Road (847)540-1696. Residents should place their container of motor oil in the yellow shed at the facility.

Keep Your Pets Safe

As the cooler weather arrives, coyote sightings increase. **Keep your pets indoors from dusk to dawn, and when walking small dogs, keep them on a leash.**



Do not feed coyotes or foxes. Keep garbage stored securely and use squirrel-proof bird feeders to prevent drawing small animals which attract coyotes or foxes.

Leaf and Yard Waste Disposal

Leaf and Yard Waste Collection Service ends November 24th and will resume in April. Leaves, grass clippings, small twigs and landscape debris should be bagged in biodegradable paper yard waste bags available at numerous retail outlets. Brush and branch material should be placed at the curb in bundles not exceeding two (2) feet in diameter and four (4) feet in length, tied with string or twine. Branches should not exceed 3" in diameter. A sticker must be applied to each bag and bundle. The sticker cost is \$1.75 each, on sale at Village Hall, Pasquesi Home & Garden, and Lake Barrington Realty. If you have any questions regarding branch/brush collection, please do not hesitate to contact Waste Management at (800) 796-9696.

Open Burning Regulations The Village permits the burning of twigs and leaves (not grass) on residential property from **October 1 through May 31st, 9:00 AM-6:00 PM.** Burning must be on the resident's property away from any building or structure. Burning in the street or right-of-way is prohibited. Fires should be constantly attended and are not permitted to smolder into the evening. Call Lake County Sheriff at (847) 549-5200 for complaints.

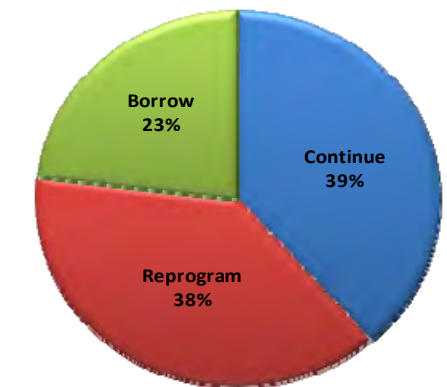
Resident Input Guides Partial Re-programming of Open Space Funds

With the strong support of Lake Barrington residents, the Village has made great strides over the past two years in achieving the goals of our community's open space initiative. Through our own land purchases as well as through our partnership with Citizens for Conservation and through the coordinated land acquisitions of the Lake County Forest Preserve, some 470 acres have been added as open space since 2007 bringing the total amount of public and private open space in Lake Barrington to 1,237 acres, or 27% of our total land use.

In response to both this tremendous success and the request of many residents for accelerated attention to infrastructure improvements across our community, the Village recently surveyed all Lake Barrington residents for their views on whether the remaining open space funds should remain exclusively dedicated to additional open space purchases or whether a portion of the remaining funds should be repositioned for infrastructure improvements. The survey options were:

- *Continue* to dedicate all of the remaining Open Space bond funds exclusively for the purchase of additional open space.
- *Reprogram* a portion of the Open Space bond funds on an as needed basis over the next several years to finance capital projects within the Village.
- *Borrow* a portion of the funds from the Open Space bond fund to support capital projects over the next several years while continuing to purchase open space in the future as borrowed funds are repaid from the Village's General Fund to the Open Space bond fund.

Survey Responses



Approximately 796 households responded to the survey (for an impressive 39% of our community). Overall, the results indicated a desire to repurpose a portion of the remaining Open Space funds for infrastructure projects with 61% selecting either the reprogramming or the borrowing option. As a result, the Village Board decided that remaining Open Space funds will be re-purposed in a manner proportionate to the community's overall responses (See table).
